PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Dear Friends in Christ,

Many of you will recognize the name of Eli Wiesel, the renowned Jewish theologian and prolific author. In his book, "All Rivers Run To The Sea" he tells of his family, living in Hungry during the dark days of the WWII. His family was waiting for their time to come, for the Nazis to arrive at their door and take them to a labor camp.

He tells about a peasant woman by the name of Maria. Maria was almost like a member of the family. She was a Christian. During the early years of the war she continued to visit them, but eventually non-Jews were no longer allowed entrance to the ghettos. That did not deter Maria. She found her way through the barbed wire and she came anyway, bringing the Wiesel's fruits, vegetables, and cheese.

One day she came knocking at their door. There was a cabin that she had up in the hills. She wanted to take the children, of which Eli was one, and hide them there before the SS came. They decided after much debate to stay together as a family, although they were deeply moved at this gesture. He writes of her:

Dear Maria. If other Christians had acted like her, the trains rolling toward the unknown would have been less crowded. If priests and pastors had raised their voices, if the Vatican had broken its silence, the enemy's hand would not have been so free. But most thought only of themselves. A Jewish home was barely emptied of its inhabitants before they descended like vultures.

I think of Maria often with affection and gratitude, he writes, and with wonder as well. This simple, uneducated woman stood taller that the city's intellectuals, dignitaries and clergy. My father had many acquaintances and even friends in the Christian community, not one of them showed the strength of character of this peasant woman. Of what value was their faith, their education, their social position, if it did not arouse their love. It was a simple and devout Christian woman who saved the town's honor.

"If I speak in the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging symbol. If I have prophetic powers and a faith so as to remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. If I give everything I have to the poor, but have not love, I am nothing" (1 Corinthians 13:1-3).

Our menu consisted of meatloaf, cheesy potato casserole, tossed salad, dinner roll, dessert, and a choice of beverage. The number of people served was 57, 4 of which were carryout. There was plenty to eat, with many enjoying seconds.

Once again the women's reading group had their "special additional needs" offering for those in attendance. Items provided included things such as paper towels, Kleenex, toilet paper, feminine products, disinfectant wipes, dishwashing liquid, body wash and other assorted items. These were made available and distributed one per family. By the end of the night, everything was gone. These items are useful and needed by many in our community.

Not only did Covid cause closure of the Community Closet, but it also made it difficult to effectively and efficiently provide our meal. Although we were successful on this night, we were missing several workers because of the pandemic. We will work very hard to continue our normal operation next month, but will keep a watchful eye on the situation and react accordingly. We must do what is best for the safety of both workers and patrons




Get Connected to St Paul's through our new Phone App.


Thursday Morning Bible Study Beginning Late January

Since they formed the duo in Fall 2013, the two have presented concerts throughout northeast Ohio, for Shiloh United Church of Christ (Dayton, OH), Trinity Episcopal Cathedral (Pittsburgh, PA), Methuen Memorial Music Hall (Methuen, MA), National City Christian Church (Washington, D.C.), National Cathedral (Washington D.C.), Bethesda By-the-Sea Episcopal Church (Palm Beach, FL), and Memorial Presbyterian Church (St. Augustine, FL). Performing new arrangements of music, including major works, they have opened several concert series programs for multiple venues.

Chad Pittman is Director of Choirs at Northwest High School in Stark County, where he conducts an active choral program of seven choirs, serves as music director of the annual musical, and assists at Northwest Middle School. He also serves as Director of Music and Organist for St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church in Massillon, where he leads the adult and children's vocal and bell choirs, facilitates a weekly program of guest artists in worship, and coordinates *Cathedral Concerts in the Evening*, the church's newly established professional concert series. He is cofounder of *Two Men and a Bench*, a traveling organ duo, with duet partner Mark Thewes. Since 2013, the two have presented concerts in churches and concert halls across the country, including the National Cathedral in Washington D.C. He is currently a doctoral student in music at Kent State University and studies in the summer Choral Conducting program at Michigan State University. He holds the Master of Educational Administration from Cleveland State University and a Bachelor of Music Education and Organ Performance from the Baldwin Wallace Conservatory of Music. When not making music or spending time with amazing students and colleagues, he enjoys traveling, collecting old/vintage vacuum cleaners, and spending time with his many cats!

Mark Thewes is a resident of Massillon and has just begun his appointment as Minister of Music for Massillon's St. Joseph Parish. He previously served as full-time Organist-Director of Music at Westbrook Park United Methodist Church, Canton for 44 years. Mark attended St. Clements grade school, where he started playing for Masses in 6th grade, and then went to Central Catholic High School. He holds both a Bachelor's Degree and Master's Degree of Music in Organ Performance from the University of Akron, and has received his certification in Church Music from Baldwin Wallace University. He is a past Dean of the American Guild of Organists (AGO), Canon chapter, and is a published composer with Morning Star Publishing Co., CPP Belwin-Warner Bros. Co., Abingdon Press, and Beckenhorst Music. Mark is an Adjunct Professor of music (organ) at Malone University and accompanist for *A Chorus for a Cause*, a community chorus, based in Canton.
