PASTOR'S PERSPECTIVE

Dear Friends in Christ,

It's so easy to pass judgment on others, isn't it? Jesus could have just as well been talking to us when he said, "Why do you worry about the speck that is in your neighbor's eye, but pay no attention to the 2" x 4" protruding from your own eye?" (Paraphrase) We all do it, don't we? We look for flaws in others and ignore our own. Actually, that is not too surprising.

Let me tell you a true story. Back in 1893 there was a group of four sisters. The Cherry Sisters they called themselves, who made their stage debut in Cedar Rapids in a skit they wrote themselves. For three years, the Cherry Sisters performed to packed theaters throughout the Midwest. People came to see them to find out if they were as bad as they had heard. Their unbelievably atrocious acting enraged critics and provoked the audience to throw vegetables at the would-be actresses. Wisely, the sisters thought it best to travel with an iron screen which they would erect in front of the stage in self-defense.

Amazingly, in 1896 the girls were offered a thousand dollars a week to perform on Broadway -- not because they were so good, but because they were so unbelievably bad. Seven years later, after the Cherry Sisters had earned what in that day was a respectable fortune of \$200,000, they retired from the stage for the peaceful life back on the farm. Oddly enough, these successful Broadway "stars" remained convinced to the end that they were truly the most talented actresses ever to grace the American stage. They never had a clue as to how bad they truly were!

The parable of the prodigal son does not tell us what the elder brother did when his father came out to speak to him. It doesn't reveal to us whether he realized that his envy and disdain had made him just as bad as his younger brother. Yes, the elder brother had never stooped to find himself in the pigpens of life. He would never have been caught dead carousing with prostitutes or wasting his resources in riotous living but in the end his refusal to rejoice at the return of his sinful brother was, to Jesus, just as offensive.

Why are we commanded not to judge one another? Because we're no good at playing God. Until we can love as God loves, then we cannot judge as God judges. But let us strive every day toward greater holiness and greater love, so that our own thoughts and actions will be acceptable in God's sight.

St. Paul's Seeking a Communications Coordinator

Church Council has decided to seek a Communications Coordinator rather than another Office Administrator. This better reflects the current needs we as a church have on a day-to-day basis. The primary purpose of this position is to initiate, coordinate, and manage the multiple modes of communication at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, working in collaboration with church staff, leadership and other members of the congregation. It is a part time salaried position – 20 hours per week which includes in-office hours 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Mon. - Fri. The full job description is available on the church web site. This is an initiative sponsored by the Ladies Book Club and has proven to be a wonderful compliment to both the Community Meal and the Community Closet. Visitors can choose among common household needs such as paper towels, Kleenex, toilet paper, feminine products, disinfectant wipes, dishwashing liquid, body wash and other assorted items. 




Seeing Gray in a World of Black and White - Beginning April 6th



Seeing Gray in a World of Black and White is a hard-hitting call for Christians to examine issues of political and social import with increased depth and acumen.

Everyone agrees that America is polarized, with ever-hardening positions held by people less and less willing to listen to one another. No one agrees on what to do about it. One solution that hasn't yet been tried, says Adam Hamilton, is for thinking persons of faith to model for the rest of the country a richer, more thoughtful conversation on the political, moral, and religious issues that divide us. Hamilton rejects the easy assumptions and sloppy analysis of black and white thinking, seeking instead the truth that resides on all sides of the issues, and offering a faithful and compassionate way forward.





As we continue through the season of Lent approaching Holy Week and Easter, we will focus our study and thoughts on the sacrificial work of Christ and the "God of peace, who brought back from the dead our Lord Jesus, the great shepherd of the sheep…" (Hebrews 13:20). Caroline's ANC was 200 today! she's been dealing with a lot of mucus/puking as her little GI tract is healing up with these new cells, it kinda gets worse before it gets better. BUT we know we are just around the corner from our sweet girl feeling so much better. GO CAROLINE GO!

Her team decided it was best to take out the PICC line that was the cause of her blood stream infection. So we removed that this morning... having one less tubie is never a bad thing! She's rocking and rolling with just her port right now.

Thankful for your prayers. We are on our way to being engrafted and hopefully home in the

next week or so 🙏 🙏 🙏

The next step for Caroline will be CT scan to see how her disease has responded to these two stem cell transplants. We are praying the lesions in her liver and lung are GONE. If the cancer has been responding, we will proceed with a third stem cell transplant. We are praying and believing this will be the final step in Caroline's total healing. Thank you for courageously battling this journey with us over the last 5 months...we can't tell you how much your prayers mean to us!
