Church Council has decided to seek a Communications Coordinator rather than another Office Administrator. This better reflects the current needs we as a church have on a day-to-day basis. The primary purpose of this position is to initiate, coordinate, and manage the multiple modes of communication at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, working in collaboration with church staff, leadership and other members of the congregation. It is a part time salaried position – 20 hours per week which includes in-office hours 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Mon. - Fri. The full job description is available on the church web site. Another said, "When I catch a cold, the ability to know exactly where and when I got it." I guess that would be for the purpose of retribution or today contact tracers would love for people to have that power.


And finally, "Always knowing when to use a semicolon." That must be for an English major.






