Dear Friends in Christ,

James S. Hewett, former pastor of Saratoga (California) Presbyterian Church shares this story: In 1923 at the Edgewater Beach Hotel in Chicago, Illinois, eight of the most powerful money-magnates in the world gathered for a meeting. These eight, if they combined their resources and their assets, controlled more money than the U.S. Treasury.

In that group were such men as Charles Schwab. He was the president of a steel company. Richard Whitney was the president of the New York Stock Exchange, and Arthur Cutton was a wheat speculator. Albert Fall was a presidential cabinet member, personally a very wealthy man. Jesse Livermore was the greatest bear on Wall Street in his generation. Leon Fraser was the president of the International Bank of Settlements. Ivan Krueger headed the largest monopoly. Quite an impressive group of people!

Let's look at the same group later in life. Charles Schwab died penniless. Richard Whitney spent the rest of his life serving a sentence in Sing Sing Prison. Arthur Cutton, that great wheat speculator, became insolvent. Albert Fall was pardoned from a federal prison so he might die at home. Leon Fraser, Jesse Livermore, Ivan Krueger all committed suicide. Seven of those eight great big money magnates had lives that were disasters before they left planet Earth.

What mistake did they make? Thinking that what they had and what they controlled belonged to them.

That is the main point of every stewardship sermon I have ever given. What we have does not belong to us, it belongs to God. Maybe another way to look at is this: If everything belongs to God, and God is a giving God, and God gives everything to us. How much are we going to keep?

Our annual stewardship drive will be on November 13th. As we prepare for this important day in the life of our church let us reflect on this spiritual question, "What is God calling me to give as a percentage of my income?" That is a personal, spiritual question as I said in the sermon last week. In the month we have before Consecration Sunday I urge you to reflect and pray on your relationship with God and how you will answer God's call to give.

At our August meeting, the congregation was asked to vote upon a ballot issue asking what accessibility project we see as most viable for our future. Results, which were reported the following Sunday prior to worship, revealed 30% of the membership felt that a full implementation addressing access concerns and additional meeting/gathering space was desirable, with 40% indicating a willingness to support the access concerns solely. While neither of these outcomes is a clear mandate, it is evident that the congregation is interested in moving forward to create a more welcoming atmosphere for individuals of all abilities.

What also was evident in the results was the congregation's desire to maintain our present infrastructure. With greater than 50% of respondents expressing a need to repair or rebuild the Harvard Street steps, and a strong interest in additional restroom facilities, we have a place to begin.

Your church council, taking each of these points and those comments that were presented into consideration, will be continuing the conversation and bringing what we perceive as next steps to you, the congregation, in the near future. Your prayers for God's guidance as we enter into these discussions is most welcome and encouraged.
