Dear Friends in Christ,

All Saints Sunday is coming up in a few weeks. Saints are those people who show us what a life lived in Christ looks like. We often think of saints as Perfect Christians, but we know that isn't true. Even Saints like Mother Teresa had their doubts. In her diary, found after her death, she expressed her frustrations on how loving God could allow such great suffering. Martin Luther was often tormented by the fact he could never be good enough to please God.

The Apostle Paul says we are both Saint and sinner at the same time. Romans 3:24-26 says, "<sup>24</sup>they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, <sup>25</sup>whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; <sup>26</sup>it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus." We are made saints not by what we do, saints are made out of the Grace of God.

I came across this piece of folklore in the collected sermons of James Moore. A famous composer had a rebellious son who used to come in late at night after his mother and father had gone to bed. And before going to his own room, this rebellious son would go to his father's piano and slowly, spitefully... and loudly would play a simple scale, all but the final note. He would play, "Do-Re-Mi-Fa-Sol-La-Ti..." and then he wouldn't strike that final "Do." Then leaving the scale unfinished, he would retire to his room.

His father, hearing the unfinished scale, would twist and turn in his bed, his mind unable to relax because the scale was not finished.

Finally, not able to stand it any longer, the father would crawl out of bed, stumble down the stairs and strike that final note of the scale. Only then could he relax and be at peace.

The unfinished scale is a good metaphor for how we live our lives. We try to please God and live the way we should but we come up short.

- We forgive, but not completely.
  - We love, but not completely.
  - We serve, but not completely.
  - We accept Christ, but not completely.
  - We live the Christian life-style but not completely.
  - We commit our lives to God, but not completely.

But even when we come up short God in his amazing grace continues to reach out to us and he continues to love us. God makes us Saints through faith in Jesus Christ.

Most in attendance visited the Community Closet either before or after the meal. With cold weather approaching, warm coats, gloves, as well as woolen socks and other warm clothing are much in need. In addition, new underwear is always in short supply. If you can buy some extra underwear and donate it to the Community Closet, we will see that it is put to good use.

Our monthly "special additional needs" offering for those in attendance was again a success. By the end of the night, with attendance booming, virtually all items were distributed. Praise God!

### **Consecration Sunday Is Coming**

#### **November 13th**

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

Our congregation's finance committee has selected the *New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

New Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. New Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, we are asking our members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every family who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily. We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship Pastor Mark will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members placing their estimate of Giving card on the Altar.
