

Dear Friends in Christ,

Some years ago, Billy Graham told about a Christian man in Boston who said to himself, "I cannot speak in prayer meetings. I cannot do many other things in Christian service. But I can put two extra plates on my dinner table every Sunday and invite two young men who are away from home to eat with me." He did so faithfully and, over the years, had a very positive ministry. His quiet witness to his faith caused many a young man to become a Christian.

When the man died, he was buried in another city. The family chartered a bus so that the funeral party could travel together. On the day of the funeral, they had to charter additional buses on short notice, because 150 people came to honor a man whose Christian service centered around the simple hospitality of two extra plates on his Sunday dinner table.

Many of our holiday traditions revolve around food. In the Jewish Seder a place is reserved at the Seder table and a cup of wine is placed there for Elijah. During the seder, the door of the house is opened and Elijah is invited in. Traditionally, the cup is viewed as Elijah's and is used for no other purpose. Many families have the tradition of going and serving at a soup kitchen or food pantry. We seek out the stranger and welcome them as family.

At a Community Thanksgiving Service a few years ago, our concluding blessing is one we can use at our dinner table. It calls us to remember the stranger and stir us to action.

O God, when we have food, help us to remember the hungry; When we have work, help us to remember the jobless; When we have a home, help us to remember those who have no home at all; When we are without pain, help us to remember those who suffer, And remembering, help us to destroy our complacency; and be concerned enough to help those who cry out for what we take for granted. Amen.

May God bless us and those we are called to serve during this season of Advent and Christmas.
