Dear Friends in Christ,

In a world filled with empty promises and temporary pleasures, the words of Isaiah 55 resonate as a refreshing invitation from the heart of God. In this passage, we are invited to come and partake in the abundant provision that God freely offers. It is an invitation that extends beyond physical nourishment to the deepest longings of our souls.

God addresses the thirsty and the impoverished, those who are aware of their need and recognize that the world's offerings cannot truly satisfy. He invites them to come to the waters, to drink and be refreshed. But this invitation goes even further; it encompasses all our needs. God invites us to buy wine and milk without money and without cost. It is an invitation to receive His grace, His love, and His abundant blessings freely.

Often, we seek fulfillment in the wrong places. We chase after worldly pleasures, possessions, and pursuits, only to find ourselves still empty and unsatisfied. We invest our time, energy, and resources in things that cannot truly satisfy the deepest longings of our hearts. We settle for temporary pleasures that fade away, leaving us longing for something more.

God's invitation in Isaiah 55 challenges us to reevaluate our priorities. Why spend our lives pursuing what does not truly satisfy? Instead, God urges us to listen attentively and to eat what is good. He desires to satisfy us with the richest of food, nourishing our souls with His truth, love, and presence. Only in Him can we find true satisfaction and fulfillment.

As we respond to God's invitation, we not only find satisfaction for ourselves but also become vessels of His blessings to others. The passage speaks of an everlasting covenant and the faithful love promised to David. In Christ, we are partakers of that covenant, recipients of His steadfast love. God's provision extends beyond our personal needs, as He empowers us to be witnesses to the peoples and instruments of His grace in the world.

The final verses of this passage speak of unexpected blessings and influence. When we align ourselves with God's purposes and live in His abundance, nations we do not know will come running to us. The splendor of God's presence and His work in our lives will be evident, drawing others to Him through our testimony and example.

Today, let us heed the invitation of Isaiah 55. Let us turn our hearts toward God, recognizing that only He can satisfy the deepest longings of our souls. May we seek Him above all else, investing our lives in what truly matters. As we do so, may we become conduits of His blessings, drawing others to Him and experiencing the splendor of His love and grace.

# Church Council Highlights

Your Church Council met on July 11th, welcoming new Council members Gayle Jackson and Kathryn Myers.

The Property and Management Committee reported on various maintenance projects, including the scheduled replacement of the concrete stairs leading up from the Harvard Avenue parking lot. The old stairs will be removed and the new slightly wider stairs are scheduled to be built in August with the construction project lasting two weeks, weather permitting. The concrete steps project is the first within the Capital Campaign. Building endowment funds as well as donations from the Capital Campaign will be used to cover the cost (as approved by the congregation at the May meeting.)

The Worship and Music Committee, in addition to the Search Committee for a new Director of Music and Organist, unanimously recommended to Council Dr. Abigail Haake to fill that position. Council unanimously approved her hiring and proposed compensation. Although Dr. Haake (Abby) will begin planning in mid August for music programs starting in September, her first Sunday as organist will be September 10th. She and her family will be introduced to the congregation on **August 20th**. She will play an anthem during the service that Sunday and join us for the church picnic scheduled for that day.

The Capital Campaign committee has been formed and includes the following members: Sue Ambosic, Gayle Jackson, Jim Johnson, and Greg Klein. Pastor Mark will also work closely with the committee.

Other action taken by Council included approval of the following: The purchase of detailed plans drawn by ProTech Systems for a fully-monitored Fire Detection System; the purchase of two new stoves for the kitchen requested by the Kitchen Angels - the cost of one covered by the Mission Endowment Fund and the other covered by Property and Management; and the purchase and installation of two condensation tank motors for the church boiler system. Other action by Council included regretfully accepting the resignation of Sharon Thieret, our Communications Coordinator, and setting the date for the annual August meeting of the congregation for Sunday, **August 27th**. Please mark your calenders!




#### **Prayer List Changes**
