## Capital Campaign Commitment Sunday October 8<sup>th</sup>, 2023

We will review the scope of the 5 projects in stage 1 of our capital improvements and make our commitments to making these projects a reality.

### St. Paul's Seeking an Administrative Assistant

The primary purpose of this position is to initiate, coordinate, and manage the multiple modes of communication at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, working in collaboration with church staff, leadership and other members of the congregation. It is a part time salaried position – 20 hours per week which includes in-office hours 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. Mon. - Fri. The full job description is available on the church web site. ### Church Council Highlights

Your Church Council met on Tuesday evening, September 12th. In Pastor Mark's report, he announced that October 29th, which is Reformation Sunday, will likely also be Confirmation Sunday for our youth. Pastor also reported that he has worked with Carol Butler to update her on various technology applications as she works approximately 6 hours a week to provide office support for Pastor Mark and Dr. Haake. We are advertising for a new office administrator but at this time, we have not received any applications. We are very grateful for Carol's willingness to help with various tasks while we wait to fill the office staff position. Pastor Mark also informed us that Eddie has been unable to work for several weeks because of a back ailment. Gary Collard has kindly agreed to help out with some of the custodial work until Eddie can return, and we thank him for his willingness. Both Carol and Gary are being paid for their services to the church.

The Capital Campaign Committee has met and scheduled a special pledge Sunday for October 8th. As of the writing of this summary, \$55,860 have been donated to cover the first capital improvement project which is the back concrete stairs leading up from the Harvard Ave. parking lot. The Kitchen Angels have donated \$8,000 to go toward the renovation of the Gleitsman Lounge, for a total amount of giving at \$63,860 for the Capital Campaign. This is a wonderful start. Thanks to all who have and will give!

Related to the Capital Campaign, and in consultation with the Property Management Committee, a request was made to reorder the capital improvement projects. The Gleitsman Lounge will be the next area to be renovated and improved, the handicap-accessible bathrooms to be built across from the lounge will be next, followed by the installation of a complete fire alarm system, and the last, renovation of the east entry of the church building to improve accessibility. The reordering was approved by Church Council. (Until the more sophisticated system can be installed, fire alarms and carbon monoxide detectors have been strategically placed throughout the three buildings on our church campus and can be monitored by several church leaders including Jim Johnson and Pastor Mark.)

As a part of the Welfare and Social Action Committee, Cindy Lash reported that the food (and other essentials) collection will begin in October for the 15 families the Salvation Army has identified for our church to support during the Christmas Season. Watch for this list of items requested for each of the upcoming Sundays through December 10th.

The Worship and Music Committee is finalizing the publicity materials for our 2023-2024 Cathedral Concert Series and will be distributed very soon. All are encouraged to attend these special concerts.

Church Council regretfully accepted the resignation of Gayle Jackson from its membership. The Church Constitution permits Church Council to "elect by majority vote a successor until the next annual meeting." If you would like to be considered for this vacancy, please let me or anyone on Council know of your interest.



# Remembering Our Shut-ins

Robert Dean Haas was born on March 9, 1928, in Strasburg, Ohio. He graduated in 1946 from Strasburg High School.

He immediately enlisted in the U.S. Army to follow in his two brothers' footsteps. He was honorably discharged in 1947 and transferred to the Army Reserves. He married his high school sweetheart in 1950. He and Bonnie had two girls, Elizabeth, and Barbara. In 1951 Bob graduated from Akron University but before getting a chance to teach he was called to active duty. He was deployed to Korea during which time he was promoted to Second Lieutenant and Commander over forty men. He returned home in July of 1953 and was back in the Reserves.

In 1953 he began his teaching and coaching career. His first year was at his alma mater, Strasburg High School. Then he was lured to Massillon Schools. From 1954 to 1985 he worked his way from a teacher and a coach, to principal of Whittier School, to Assistant Superintendent of Massillon City Schools. In 1985 he retired from the school system but couldn't sit still so he went to work for a reserve life insurance company as director of Union benefits. He retired in 1995.

Bob spent 50 years in the military retiring as Major General of the Ohio Military Reserves. He received 18 medals and awards for his service.

His two most honorable achievements was becoming Commander of the Ohio Military Reserves in 1993 and being inducted into the Ohio Veterans Hall of Fame.

At 95 Bob enjoys a quieter life. He still loves spending time with his family and friends and his dog Butch, and has a million stories he can tell.

He enjoys sweets and yes, occasionally a glass of Wine!



Composer, conductor, organist, preacher, and teacher Tom Trenney has been blessed to serve as Minister of Music to First-Plymouth Church in Lincoln, Nebraska, since 2009. In 2019, he became Associate Professor of Music and Director of Choirs at Nebraska Wesleyan University. He serves as Music in Worship Chair for Midwest ACDA. Tom has been a featured performer at churches, colleges, and concert halls across the country and his choral compositions are published by Augsburg Fortress, Beckenhorst Press, Choristers Guild, E.C. Schirmer/Galaxy, Morningstar, Musicspoke, Pavane, and G. Schirmer. Tom is a graduate of the Cleveland Institute of Music and the Eastman School of Music.

The Plymouth Choir sings weekly for worship at First-Plymouth Church in Lincoln, Nebraska—a diverse and inclusive community of faith called to increase the love of God and neighbor. The choir's rich history has included more than a dozen recordings, five international tours, and performances under legendary conductors Recent performances have taken the choir from McCook, Nebraska, to Painesville, Ohio; from Washington's Kennedy Center to NYC's Carnegie Hall; and from Matt Talbot Kitchen and Outreach to the Nebraska State Penitentiary.

The University of Michigan Men's Glee Club is the second oldest collegiate chorus in the United States, and has long been acclaimed as one of the finest male choruses in the world.
