Church Council Highlights

Your Church Council met on Tuesday, October 10th. The evening before, we had received word that our brother-in-Christ and fellow Council member, Don Gray, had died after a short illness. We opened and ended our meeting with prayer, giving thanks for the privilege of knowing and loving Don and for his work in the various ministries at St. Paul's. He will be dearly missed.

It was reported that pledges were received by many in our congregation on Sunday, October 8th, to financially support the capital campaign. Individuals who were not in attendance on that Sunday may still make a commitment to give by filling out a pledge form and placing it in the offering plate or dropping it off at the church office.

The first capital improvement project, the stairs leading up from the Harvard Ave. parking lot, has been completed. The final cost of the project was \$87,364. The next capital improvement project will be the renovation of Gleitsman Lounge. A motion was made and passed to once again reorder the projects so, after the lounge, the next project will likely be the renovation of the east entry of the church building to improve accessibility. The reordering is due to a sizeable donation that will be received from Rick Richards specifically targeting the entry way renovation. As capital campaign funds continue to be received, work can also be done to complete the lounge renovation and begin the new accessible bathroom construction across from the lounge.

With the vacancy left by Gayle Jackson's resignation, David Stoner asked to be considered for her term. Council unanimously voted to approve inviting David to join Council. Official action to fill the seat will occur at the next congregational meeting to be held in May, per the Church Constitution. Council is very grateful for David's willingness to serve.

A motion was made and approved to hire Jennifer Daly to serve as church custodian while Eddie Langford is on unpaid leave. Carol Butler has been hired to offer a few hours each week in office support including maintaining the church website, the outdoor sign, the bulletin, and copying. We are grateful to Carol and Jennifer for their willingness to help in these essential areas.


