



into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, ⁷and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. ⁸Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; ⁹for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead. ¹⁰Then the disciples returned to their homes.

¹¹But Mary stood weeping outside the tomb. As she wept, she bent over to look into the tomb; ¹²and she saw two angels in white, sitting where the body of Jesus had been lying, one at the head and the other at the feet. ¹³They said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She said to them, "They have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid him." ¹⁴When she had said this, she turned around and saw Jesus standing there, but she did not know that it was Jesus. ¹⁵Jesus said to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you looking for?" Supposing him to be the gardener, she said to him, "Sir, if you have carried him away, tell me where you have laid him, and I will take him away." ¹⁶Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to him in Hebrew, "Rabbouni!" (which means Teacher). ¹⁷Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God.'" ¹⁸Mary Magdalene went and announced to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord"; and she told them that he had said these things to her.

William Billings is the first published American composer of psalms and hymns. Born with vision in only one eye and uneven legs, Billings started music lessons as a young boy with a local choirmaster, and by the late 1760's, he had become America's first professional composer. He organized the first church choir in America and made history with the publication of the book *New England Psalm-Singer*, the first tune book given entirely to the music of one American composer. Billings did much to further music reading and singing in early America, and he fostered the shape-note tradition— four part a cappella singing using different shaped notes to represent different scale degrees.

On this final day of Women's History month, we feature music by the well-known composer, conductor, and clinician, Sondra Tucker. Her sacred compositions for handbells, organ, and choir are in the catalogs of most major church music publishing houses. She was Founder and Artistic Director of the Houston Chamber Ringers, and also founded the Pyramid Ringers of Memphis, Tennessee. She leads denominational seminars as well as numerous Handbell Musicians of America local, area, and national events. Ms. Tucker is a retired church musician living in Houston, Texas, and is Handbell Editor for Alfred Handbell, a division of Jubilate Music Group. She holds a Bachelor's degree in music education from The University of Arkansas and a Master of Sacred Music degree from the University of Memphis.


Adult Sunday School What Just Happened?


