

The Canton Symphony Orchestra Chorus, under the direction of Doug Beery, comes to St. Paul's following a sold-out performance at the Holiday Pops concert and a magnificent rendition of Mozart's Requiem in March. Permanently founded in 1983 by then music director Dr. Jeffrey H. Brandes, the CSO Chorus is an auditioned choral ensemble composed of all volunteer vocalists from the greater Stark County area.

Director Douglas Beery has twenty-three years of secondary public school teaching experience in addition to graduate assistant conducting appointments at The Ohio State University and most recently, Kent State University, where he served as conductor of the Kent State University Men's Chorus and assistant conductor of the KSU Chorale. Choral ensembles under his direction have successfully toured Ohio, the United States, and Europe. In addition, he has held the baton as the music director and conductor for twenty-two Broadway musical productions. Mr. Beery received a Bachelor of Music degree from Capital University and a Master of Music degree in Choral Conducting from The Ohio State University. Additional Doctoral work has been credited in Music Education with a cognate in Conducting at Kent State University. Further graduate conducting study has taken place at the University of Michigan and Miami University.

Program Notes

Freedom Come: This piece, from the Fifth Movement of *Bandari*: *Inside These Walls* by Ben Allaway, is set in the style of a South African Freedom Song. The work itself pays homage to Nelson Mandela, the first Black president of South Africa from 1994-1999. His negotiations with F. W. De Klerk helped to end the country's apartheid system of racial segregation and brought about a peaceful transition to majority rule. Mandela's *brilliance* brought True Light to South Africa and the world!

Salmo 150: Ernani Aguiar is a Brazilian composer well known for both his choral and short instrumental pieces. Aguiar's compositional technique is very rhythmic with rapid articulations, representative of the Latin American rhythms, traditions, and style.

My Soul's Been Anchored in the Lord: Moses Hogan was a celebrated composer, arranger, conductor, and pianist. His settings of spirituals created a new landmark and standard for the arrangement, composition, and performance practice of these traditional songs. Despite passing at the early age of 45, he published 88 vocal arrangements.

Choose Something Like a Star: In 1958, Randall Thompson commissioned a work on the occasion of Amherst, Massachusetts's 200th anniversary. The people of Amherst asked that the work be set to the poetry of Robert Frost, a longtime resident of the town. *Frostiana* is a suite of seven poems subtitled *Seven Country Songs*. "Choose Something Like a Star," is the seventh and final movement of the work, which textually and musically searches for meaning in life through a passionately secular viewpoint.

Stars: A Latvian composer, Ēriks Ešenvalds is an original and sought-after voice of the Baltic music tradition. "Stars" exhibits Ešenvalds' focus on harmonic transition and flow, interweaving the eight-part sonority of the choral parts with the beautiful clarity and transparency of glasses and Tibetan bowls. The poetry of Sara Teasdale is brought to life, elucidating a picturesque description of the heavens on the clearest of nights: a longing for something beyond that which we know.

True Light: A composer, conductor, and teacher, Keith Hampton is best known for his arrangements of gospel songs and spirituals. In 2010, Hampton was named one of the top 25 contemporary composers by the North Central American Choral Directors Association. "True Light" exemplifies Hampton's ability to bring text alive through his strength in arranging and composing gospel choral music.

COLLABORATIVE PIANIST LISA MADAFFER

Our pianist Lisa Madaffer earned her Bachelor of Music in piano performance and music theory, summa cum laude and with departmental honors, from Kent State University and her Master of Music from Bowling Green State University. She went on to do post master's work at the Cleveland Institute of Music. Her primary teachers include Margaret Baxtresser, Virginia Marks, Thomas Hecht, and Sandra Shapiro. Ms. Madaffer was the 1987 winner of the Tuesday Musical Club competition and the 1989 runner-up in the MTNA Competition. As the winner of the BGSU concerto competition, she performed the Schumann Piano Concerto with the university orchestra under the baton of Robert Spano.

English Translations of Mozart's Requiem

The Requiem in D minor, K. 626, a "mass for the dead," was composed in part by Mozart at Vienna in late 1791. The completed version has been attributed to Franz Xavier Sussmayer and was finished in 1972. The full work of orchestra and chorus was commissioned by Count Franz von Walsegg for a requiem service to commemorate the first anniversary of the death of his wife, Anna. The circumstance of Mozart's death during Requiem's composition and its subsequent attribution lend to an intrigue nearly as compelling as this most outstanding of choral/orchestral works.
