# Pastoral message: The Necessity of Communal Worship During Summer

**Scripture Reading: Hebrews 10:24-25 (NIV)**

*"And let us consider how we may spur one another on toward love and good deeds, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching."*

We welcomed new Council members Dwight Butler, Shane Jackson, and Barb Palmer, who will begin serving on Council July 1st. Dennis Morgan and Jackie Pritchett were unable to attend this meeting but will also assume office on July 1st.

## Kathryn Myers to present sermon

Pastor Mark reported that Kathryn Myers will preach the sermon and Pastor Lynn Williamson will preside over communion while he is on vacation June 23rd.

## Impact Massillon

Pastor also reported that Impact Massillon went very well and thanked Scott Larson and Johnny Stanko for their leadership the work that was done on two homes by our church volunteers with help from the football team.

## Capital Campaign Plans

Pastor Mark also shared that he would be getting together members of the Capital Campaign Committee and the Property Committee to review the initial plans that architect John Picard prepared and possibly suggest tweaks before more detailed plans are drawn up.

## Budget Approved

Dan Farrar reported that the expenses in May were much greater than expected (mostly due to building maintenance issues) and that much of the anticipated surplus which was expected to be left at year end was used to pay the bills for the month.

# Recipes from the Fundraising Dinner

Maybe you'd like to recreate one of the delicious offerings from the dinner. Sue Reid shares the recipes for her celebrated Chocolate Bourbon Pecan Pie and Vinegar Pie Crust.

**Recipe:** **Chocolate Bourbon Pecan Pie**  
From the Kitchen of: **Sue Reid**

1-9" Pie Crust	Preheat oven to <b>325 degrees</b>
1 cup white sugar	In a small saucepan combine sugar, corn syrup and butter. Cook over medium heat, stirring, until butter melts and sugar dissolves. Cool Slightly.
1 cup light corn syrup	
1/2 cup butter	
4 eggs beaten	
1 teaspoon vanilla	In a larger bowl combine eggs, vanilla, bourbon & salt. Mix well. Pour sugar mixture into egg mixture, whisking constantly. Stir in chips & pecans.
1/4 cup bourbon (optional)	
1/4 teaspoon salt	
1 1/2 cup chopped pecans	Pour into pie shell
6 ounces semi sweet or dark choc.	
Bake 50-55 minutes, or until golden brown. Serve warm or chilled.

**Recipe: Vinegar Pastry**

From the Kitchen of: **Sue Reid**

3 cups all-purpose flour, sifted	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Combine flour, sugar, salt and baking powder in a large mixing bowl.</li> <li>Add shortening in pieces to flour mix and cut into the flour with a pastry blender until appears crumbled.</li> <li>Beat together egg, vinegar and water.</li> <li>Sprinkle 4 tablespoons over flour mixture and stir with fork. Add 4 more tablespoons and stir until forms into a ball. Dough should be cold. It may need to be chilled in refrigerator for 30 minutes if it does not feel cold to touch. When ready, divide dough in half and roll for crust. Will make 2 bottom or top and bottom for pie.</li> </ul>
1 tablespoon sugar	
1/2 teaspoon salt	
1/4 teaspoon baking powder	
1 1/4 cup <b>chilled</b> shortening	
1 egg	
1 tablespoon vinegar	
5 tablespoons <b>cold</b> water

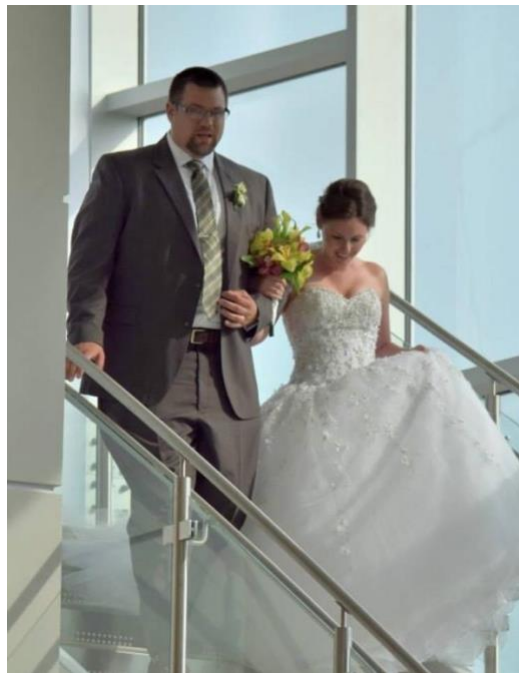
