
Joseph and God's Grace

The Message of Jesus: Words That Changed the World

The four New Testament Gospels aren't the same story, but they offer the same Resurrection hope. Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John devote most of their story detailing Jesus' last week in Jerusalem, all highlighting Jesus' triumphant entry into the city, the suffering and humiliation of the cross, and the empty tomb come Sunday morning, but the stories they tell aren't quite the same.

Each Gospel offers a different lens through which we understand Jesus' Passion. One portrait reveals Jesus to be in control, while another emphasizes his suffering. In one story Jesus offers hope to the thief on the cross, and in another Jesus only receives derision. These different perspectives aren't a reason to dismiss the Gospels; rather the reveal an abundant, diverse, and complementary picture of God's work in the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus.

Church Council Highlights

Report from April 8, 2025

Pastor's Report

In his report, Pastor Mark announced that the date for Impact Massillon will be Saturday, June 14. Scott Larson has graciously agreed to be the project leader for St. Paul's. Watch for volunteer recruiting efforts, coming soon!

Finance Committee

On behalf of the Finance Committee, Dan Farrar and Tracie Schmolt presented the recommended church operating budget for the next fiscal year, beginning July 1, 2025. The recommended budget comes out of the Finance Committee and is then shared with Council for its review. After carefully considering each line of the budget for both expenses and sources of income, Council approved the recommended budget, which will now be presented to the congregation for final approval at the May 18th business meeting.

Nominating Committee

The Nominating Committee plans to meet after the service on Sunday, April 13, to begin the process of identifying individuals willing to run for various elected positions, including four Council members, two members for the Mission Endowment Fund Committee, two individuals

to be the 2026 Synod Assembly representatives, and six members for the 2026 Nominating Committee. It is hoped there will be those willing to accept the opportunity to serve in these various positions.

Property Management Committee

Dennis Morgan reported for the Property Management Committee. Buxton Roofing is continuing its work on the flat roof areas around the church building as is Coon Restoration on the stonework of the church. These projects will be completed soon, weather permitting. When the cranes are gone, that will signal completion! The Standard Heating & Plumbing Company is now in full possession of the new boiler system that will soon be installed in the church building. It is anticipated installation will begin in mid to late May and last for several weeks.

Mission Endowment Fund Committee

Two proposals came to Council from the Mission Endowment Fund Committee. It was proposed that \$500 be donated to the local Meals on Wheels. The second proposal came from the Property Management Committee asking that \$13,325 be set aside in the Capital Improvement Fund and used to continue switching the Parish Hall heating and cooling system to split units, as has been done for the lounge and choir practice area. (Note: as specified in the St. Paul's Church Constitution under "Continuing Resolutions" for the Mission Endowment Fund (CR1.14), "Up to 15% for capital improvements, debt reduction or a building program of St. Paul's" may be contributed annually.)

Capital Campaign Committee

Reporting for the Capital Campaign committee, Pastor Mark presented the final bid details to Council for the north entrance renovation and portico enclosure as well as for the fully accessible restrooms to be built across from the Gleitzman Lounge. The final bids were received from the general contractor Paragon Builders and Developers, D & A Plumbing and Heating, ComfortPro Heating & Cooling, and Wood Electric, Inc. The total cost of the capital improvement project, which includes the fee for the architect and project manager, John Picard, is \$396,278. Council approved the bids. The Council president will sign the contracts for each of the companies, which includes a construction start date of May 19, 2025. So far, \$382,538 has been raised for the project leaving \$13,740. We are so grateful to the Lord Jesus and the faithfulness of this congregation, as so many have generously given over many months to allow these projects to begin. Thanks be to God!

Sonnenberg Station Delivered a Strong Performance




